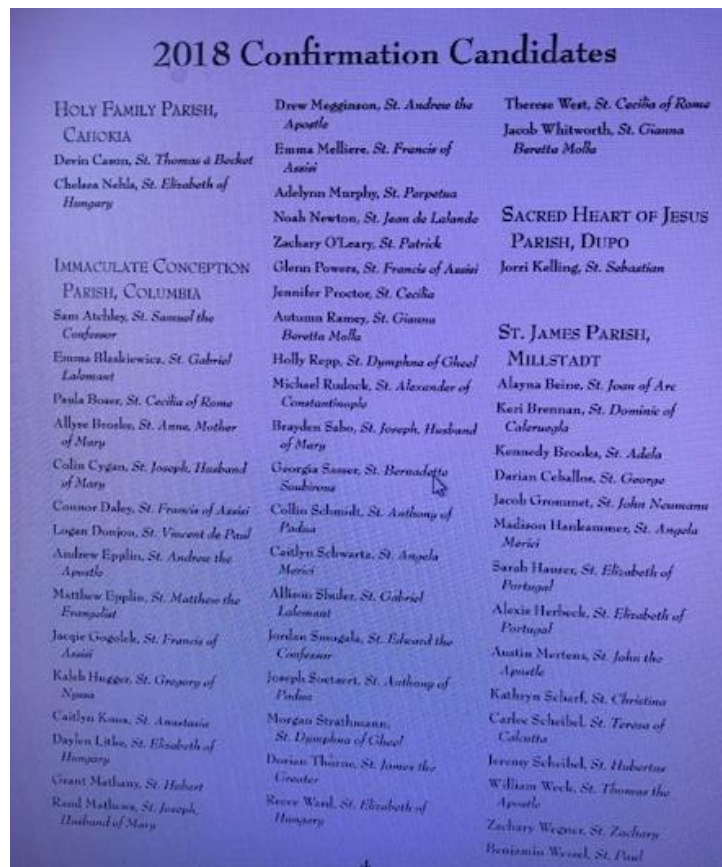

Church (consider bringing ladder)

Clean spots on church floor

Replace hanging light behind altar

Tighten bollard lights in front of church

Clean front door glass, gathering space glass, office door glass and exterior glass doors in gathering space

Dust gathering space furniture including the grouping near the elevator. Dust cabinets and counter tops in Father's vesting room.

Clean lower garden level windows including those in the elevator area. Wipe down the elevator interior walls.

Clean windows in main stair well as high as can be reached.

Dust the office area, Father's office, conference room and hallway ledges. Clean glass in these areas also.

Dust cabinets in warming kitchen and clean counter tops.

Check bumper stops in parking lot and realign, if necessary

Clean black drop box outside office exterior doors

Clean lower windows and ledges in hallway to garden area.

Dust west side pews. Dust confessional and ledges in west area leading to back stairs. Dust cabinets and counter tops in work sacristy area.

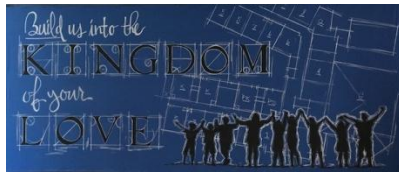
