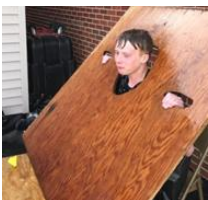

FIELD TRIPS GALORE

Down on the Parker Farm



Our Third Graders visited Parker Dairy Farm on Wednesday, April 18th. The students have been learning about simple machines in the classroom. On the farm, they were able to enjoy hands on experience with some antique simple machines, and were able to witness the progression of simple machines into modern day robotics/technology. They were given a tour of the robotic milking system and got to make homemade butter, among many other explorations. Thanks to Marvin Parker for letting us go "down on the farm"!



Water, Water Everywhere - Fourth Grade Field Trip

On April 24th the fourth graders took a field trip to Camp Wartburg in Waterloo and the Sewage Treatment Plant in Columbia. While visiting Camp Wartburg the students conducted water tests on the creek water and pond water. They tested for phosphates, nitrates, nitrites, and the pH for both samples. They documented and analyzed their findings to determine if the water in both locations was healthy or polluted. The

students also took time to find critters in the water and look at them under the microscopes. They identified the living creatures they found. While at Camp Wartburg, they also went on a nature hike. While hiking, they learned about some of the plants and trees, identified insects, and looked for

fossils next to the creek. By observing the fossils, they were able to identify what they thought made the fossil. In the afternoon, the students took a tour of the Sewage Treatment Plant and learned about the process of how sewage water gets cleaned before going into the river.

GOTR Week 7 – Compromise and TWO Miles!!!! We can't always get our way! It is a tough lesson for many of us, right? This week, the girls learned the benefits of compromising and how to go about it when trying to make a decision with others. They learned the different ways to make a good group decision – how to brainstorm, discuss, vote, and decide. They then put this lesson to action as they began discussions on what their team's community service project, an essential requirement for GOTR, will be for this year. Stay tuned...details will be coming!

Plus, the girls ran their first two miles this week! They are getting closer and closer. They have decided to make their first practice 5K at the ICS 5K next Friday night! We hope you will all be there to cheer them on!
