

From Catie Taylor's Aunt:

"Friends & Family,

You will recall that my son Michael has been battling Ewing's Sarcoma cancer going on 3 years now. 9 months ago we celebrated that the cancer in his pelvis had gone dormant (inactive) due to chemo therapy at "Primary Children's Hospital" and radiation treatments at the "Huntsman Cancer Center" in Salt Lake City.

He was given clearance to serve an LDS Mission and received a call to serve in San Antonio, TX Spanish Speaking. He spent 6 weeks in the MTC (Missionary Training Center). The last few weeks

he was suffering with head aches and jaw pain, thought to be caused, by having a wisdom tooth removed. After having a CT scan to make sure everything was OK, it was discovered that the Ewing's Sarcoma had returned and was now in his head. He has a 3 cm tumor pushing up on his brain and affecting his jaw muscles.

He was given an honorable medical release from the mission, and Janet and I went to the MTC to bring him home only a few days before he was to fly out to San Antonio to begin his service.

He spent last week recovering from surgery to his head for a biopsy. To his pelvis for bone marrow and a tube placed in his heart. He now has a port in his chest and a titanium plate in his head.

He has chosen to battle Ewing's Sarcoma a second time. This Wednesday his battle begins with intense radiation treatments at Huntsman and 6 months of chemo at Primary Children's. Your thoughts and prayers in his behalf are welcomed as he begins to battle this cancer once again. (Prayers for Mighty Mike)"




