Dear Parent, Guardian, Student, Teacher, Friend,



May Crowning was a great tribute this year. Mary is a thread for us to Jesus and this thread can often hold the beads of the Rosary. Tomorrow is the 100th Anniversary of the apparition of Our Lady at Fatima in Portugal. 1. Replace bulb in office hallway
2. Clean front door glass, gathering space glass, office door glass and exterior glass doors in gathering space
3. Dust gathering space furniture including the grouping near the elevator. Dust cabinets and counter tops in Father's vesting room.
4. Clean lower garden level windows including those in the elevator area. Wipe down the elevator interior walls.

5. Clean windows in main stair well as high as can be reached.
6. Dust the office area, Father's office, conference room and hallway ledges. Clean glass in these areas
Dust cabinets in warming kitchen and clean counter tops.
7. Clean lower garden level windows including those in the elevator area. Wipe down the elevator interior walls.
8. Clean Glass in the Reservation Chapel Room.
9. Dust west side pews. Dust confessional and ledges in west area leading to back stairs. Dust cabinets and counter tops in work sacristy area.
10. Clean west side lower windows. Several people will be needed to carefully move the candle holder in from the Mary's statue.
11. Dust the east side pews including the music area, piano and organ. Dust music storage room and rear confessional
12. Clean lower windows on the east side including the window in the music storage room and confessional
13. Clean upper windows in the gathering space including the altar side. This will take a 10 to 12 foot ladder.
14. Clean lower windows and ledges in hallway to garden area.
15. Clean high windows and ledges in hallway to garden area.
16. Clean lower windows and ledges in Garden Level
17. Clean windows in Kitchen and back stairs
18. Dust library and clean windows. Dust doors and clean windows in doors to knights room and quilters room
19. Clean stair rails
