It was the perfect ending to a very rewarding program. A Note from the Coaches: Watching how much these girls have grown throughout the past ten weeks has been a beautiful experience. We will miss our weekly training sessions with the girls and can't wait to work with them again next year. In the meantime, keep your star power shining bright, girls!
