Marie Prindiville is 2-Time State Track Champion!

ICS 8th grader, Marie Prindiville, finished 1st in the 800m and 1600m races at the SIJHSAA State Track & Field Championships in Herrin, IL. Marie set a new state record in the 800m with a time of 2:29.4 and ran 5:36.18 in the 1600 (just 5 hundredths of a second off the state record of 5:35.13).



At the State Track Meet in Herrin, IL on Saturday, May 13th, the ICS Girls team of Marie Prindiville, Megan Levin, Zoe Swip, Emma Melliere, Holly Repp and Emma Blaskiewicz placed 5th out of over 50 schools with 23 team points. Dominic Dalpoas and Jacob Feldker also competed in the Boys division. Marie Prindiville is a State Champion in both the 1600m and 800m races! Marie set a new State and ICS record in the 800m with a time of 2:29.4! Marie's winning time in the 1600m of 5:36.18 was only 5 hundredths of a second off of the State record!

Megan Levin finished 7th in the Long Jump with a leap of 14'10".

Jacob Feldker finished 7th in the 800m with a personal best time of 2:23.70.

The 4x400 Girls Relay team of Holly Repp, Emma Blaskiewicz, Emma Melliere and Marie Prindiville finished 8th and medaled with a time of 4:47.84.

Dominic Dalpoas finished 10th in the 1600m with a personal best time of 5:28.36

The Girls 4x200 Relay Team of Megan Levin, Holly Repp, Emma Blaskiewicz and Emma Melliere placed 10th with a time of 2:03.23

Zoe Swip placed 11th in the Discus with a throw of 73'10" and 15th in the Shotput with a heave of 24'4".

GOD'S PEACE TO MR. FLOYD CROWDER AND FAMILY!

Lots of memories with the passing of Columbia attorney Floyd Crowder. Floyd was President of the Board of the Oerter Foundation which bought our first laptop lab at ICS. He was also very supportive of our musicals as President of the Dorothy Weinel Eppinger Foundation. Floyd believed in getting a good education and helping schools provide it. God's peace to him, his wife Judith, and his family!

Floyd Edward Crowder, 84, of Columbia, died May 18, 2017 at St. Anthony's Hospital in St. Louis, Mo. He was born Jan. 30, 1933, in Warnock, the son of the late William C. and Lula I. (nee Smith) Crowder. He was married to Judith (nee Easton) Crowder in 1969, at the Graham Chapel at Washington University in St. Louis, Mo. Floyd E. Crowder, JD '58, was founder of the Crowder and Scoggins law firm. He was also the C.E.O. of the Monroe County Title Co. Mr. Crowder received his AB degree from Washington University in 1955, and his law degree from the Washington University School of Law in 1957. After graduation, he served three years as a Judge Advocate in the U.S. Air Force. In 1960, Crowder entered private practice in East St. Louis. Three years later he established his own general practice of law in Columbia. Today, the firm of Crowder and Scoggins, Ltd., is comprised of six attorneys. During his professional career, Mr. Crowder was the Monroe County States Attorney from 1964 to 1968, and also in 1976. In addition, he served as Special Assistant Attorney General for the State of Illinois from 1969 until 1983. A former president of the St. Clair and the Monroe County Bar Associations, Crowder was a member of the Illinois Bar Association and the Missouri Bar, and a fellow of the American Bar Association. He was active in community and philanthropic activities and served as president of the Sophia and Elmer Oerter Charitable Foundation, Dorothy Weinel Eppinger Foundation, and Crowder Family Foundation. Mr. Crowder was also a member of the Washington University School of Law's National Council. He was a recipient of Washington University Law School's 2001 Distinguished Alumni Award. Mr. Crowder was awarded the Air Force Commendation Medal by the Secretary of the Air Force for his Meritorious Service. In addition to his wife, Mr. Crowder is survived by his children, John Crowder, Carolyn Messerly, Joy (Mark) Scoggins, Andrea (Paul) Khoury and Michelle (Tim) Walkonis; grandchildren, Martha (Ryan) Burgett, Aaron Crowder, Stephanie Van Sant, Colleen and Caleb Messerly, Blaine, Haley and Clayton Scoggins, Caide, Cole, Ava and Cruz Khoury, and Floyd "Owen" and Dane Gaither; a brother, Charles H. (Marian) Crowder; and brother-in-law and sisters-in-law, Mavis (William) Caswell, Allan Easton and Kimberly (Robert) Pierce, along with many relatives and close friends. He was preceded in death by his sister, Lena Bean; brothers James H. Garris and Alfred Crowder; and son-in-law, John Messerly.

Visitation is Saturday, May 20, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., at Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Columbia. A private service and burial will follow. Memorials may be made to St. Anthony's Charitable Foundation or the American Heart Association. Lawlor Funeral Home handled the arrangements.
