Fifth SUNDAY OF EASTER Memorial Day Weekend

Jn 14:27-31a

If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father; for the Father is greater than I. For a significant part of my life, I understood “Christ” to be the second name of Jesus, as in: “Have you met Jesus, son of Joseph and Mary Christ?” It was only much later that I understood Christ was not a name but a way to describe the dynamic power of God. While Jesus was limited by his earthly existence, the risen Christ existed since the beginning of time and exists within all of creation. I still find this concept mind-boggling! No wonder the disciples had difficulty understanding Jesus when he spoke of “returning to the Father” and “sending an Advocate.” It wasn’t until they experienced the risen Christ in their own lives that they began to understand his words. They had witnessed God through the life and works of Jesus. Now they were being sent to reveal God’s life and works in everyone they met.
