GOOD TO BE BACK

I never knew how hard it is to lose your Mom. After attending hundreds of funerals and wakes and spending my life around Scripture, you would think it would be easier. But it is not. So with Jesus on the mourning bench and meeting every "first play at Gibault without Mom" etc. on my mind, I know I will work through it. Thanks to Fr. Carl, Fr. Steve Humphrey, Fr. Ray Englehart, Fr. Vince Hazlehorst, Fr. Gary Gummersheimer, Fr. Marvin Volk, Fr. Clyde Grogan, Fr. George Mauch, and for all the Masses and Perpetual Adorations in her name. Thank you for the prayers, attending visitation, coming to the Mass of Christian Burial, the music and ministering at the Liturgy, all the food, the cards, the donations to the Eugene J. Schorb/Immaculate Conception Fund for Catholic Education, Gibault Catholic High School, the fund for the Catholic Education and Activities Center, the flowers and decorative art pieces, and keeping school open while I was gone for her "living wake, . She loved our school and put 11 kids through it and most of her grand-kids and great-grand-kids too.

A few words from my reflection at her Liturgy: Mom Betty Ann Kish

In Sirach 26 it states **Happy the husband of a good wife**---we can paraphrase that to Happy the Wife of a good husband and Happy the children, grandchildren and great grandchildren of good parents. Some people get a funeral. Mom gets a celebration.

Special thanks to my A.C.T.S. brothers and sisters who had a retreat scheduled here today. They postponed till July 30.

Survived by 11 children, a sister and a brother, 27 grandchildren, 21. Great grandchildren, 3 sister-in laws, and the Crucifix of the image St. John Paul II's crozier which she brought home from St. Clare Hospital.

This was the longest amount of time the brothers and sisters have been together since August of 1967! We had 51 of us singing on May 21st. Her "living wake Mass" was May 22 and she was in attendance.

Mom had a Heart attack on May 17, brought her home on May 20th When we brought Mom home rather than have her die trying to get dialysis, we talked of a living wake---**she said just don't put me on television.**

Joy is the most infallible sign of God's love, Mom sure had it!

Mom has been with us so long we took her for granted---we thought she would always be with us--- Just like God---we take God for granted. And like our God who won't leave us, Mom won't either. Mom is more proud of us than we are of her.

Mom's family: Her relatives built our original church. The Schulers, Einwichts, Beckerles Frierdichs built the Catholic Church while the Schmidt side was helping build the Lutheran Church across Main Street.. Mom was born on the site of the rectory just sold in January. Mom was born less than a mile from where she would die at home where she had lived since 1953.

Mom and Dad's biggest goal was to treat all 11 kids alike....she wanted us to get along. Mom and Dad built church too. It's us!

Life for mom was about kids and the final word is life. She really has it now. Mom can sing again and dance again and tell jokes again be with dad and all the people she has known again

We often asked Mom how we could make her more comfortable. **She would say Surprise me.** At 4:55 am on June 1, Jesus asked Mom what he could do to make her feel more comfortable. **Mom answered "Surprise me".**
