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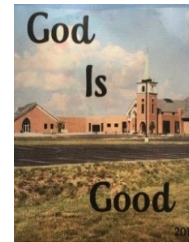

## **HELLO LATCHKEY FAMILIES!**

We are going into a new school year and a new experience and I wanted to give you some information about how we are going to proceed with the new guidelines due to Covid-19. We will practice social distancing everyday before and after school and we have safety measures in place to ensure our kids and the environment around them are as clean as possible. In accordance with the new policies, please note that this year, because of the limited number of children allowed in groups, please register your child weekly when you are going to place them in latchkey. The weekly registrations will be emailed to you on the Friday of the following week. Also, please note that we are happy to provide this service to children who have no supervision at home or options for other care outside of our school. We will send out entry and departure procedures soon. Please remember that we can no longer have snacks brought from home (except for medical health needs) and no toys or electronic devices can be brought in either (but if you are bringing an approved personal device for school, that will be permissible). We want each student to bring their own towel or mat for activities to be used during the week and then sent home on Fridays.

### **CHILD PROTECTION BIG NEWS:**

1. Initial course AND refresher course are available online!
2. ALL coaches need to be fingerprinted, most of you do this already, but this is something that needs to be adjusted at this point. I would also recommend that go ahead and have employees hired before 2007 fingerprinted at this point as well. They are/were grandfathered in but with the other change it seems to make sense that everyone would need to do that. The closest Accurate Biometric station that the Diocese uses is in Glen Carbon right now. Researching other options.

### **Best Practices for Use of Social Networking Site in Programs/Teaching**

The following best practices should be kept in mind when considering **the use of social networking sites for programs** that involve youth under the age of 18:

- Always obtain permission from the pastor, principal, parish life coordinator or agency director before using a social networking site for a program.
- Inform parents in writing that you are planning to use a social networking site.
- Establish a parish or school account; never use a personal account.
- Site administrators should be adults.
- The site should be set up as a public site to allow for transparency in all communications and postings. Any exceptions should be approved by the pastor, principal, parish life coordinator or agency director in accordance with local and diocesan policies.
- The administrators should pre-approve and regularly monitor all content, comments and postings. Any inappropriate content should be deleted. Administrators can ban users who fail to follow local and diocesan policies in regards to social media and technology, but also including those on respect, bullying, and sexual harassment.
- Post and distribute Rules of Conduct.
- The main purpose of the site should be for faith formation and education. The site should provide general communication about group events.
- All information displayed should reflect the Catholic faith.
- Do not invite a minor to be a friend; the minor must make the request. For instance, when using Facebook, accounts should be set up as a "page" verses a standard friend page. Therefore an individual will request "like" the page to access information on it.
- Do not 'tag' (label) any pictures.

If you are joining us for Mass in church, please bring your mask, and we will be taking your name and phone number when you arrive. **To minimize contact, doors will not open until approximately 20 minutes before each Mass begins.**

*NEW THING: We are experimenting with a QR-code check-in at church. If you have your phone out and it reads QR codes, it will be directed to [mycovidcheckin.com](https://mycovidcheckin.com) at the Immaculate Conception page, you'll complete a profile with identifying info, and voila, you are "checked in." This is temporary information that goes straight to the parish and is deleted after a few weeks. Subsequent check-ins will take seconds with the QR code. You are welcome to continue using the old-fashioned pen & paper method, too, we're going to be keeping that. THANKS to parishioner Michael Ecklekamp for providing the fancy tech for free.*

**Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 09 August 2020**

1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a. Ps. 85:9, 10, 11-12, 13-14. Romans 9:1-5. Mt. 14:22-33.

**Jesus Shows Us God.** In his time of trial, Elijah is looking for the Lord to save him. The psalmist pleads for God's salvation. Paul recounts the covenantal bond

between God and all the People of God. And Jesus--Jesus feeds those who hunger. Jesus tries (again!) to go off and pray. But he sees his disciples in peril and walks on troubled water to offer courage and safety.

- How will I keep looking for God in this troubled time?
- How will I act because God chose me – and us?
- How will I take courage and not be afraid trusting in Jesus' power to save?
