**CAPITAL CAMPAIGN FOR OUR NEW CATHOLIC EDUCATION AND ACTIVITY CENTER**

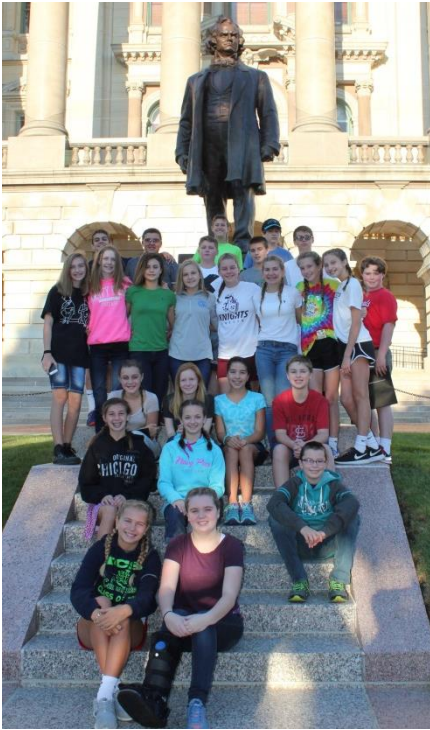

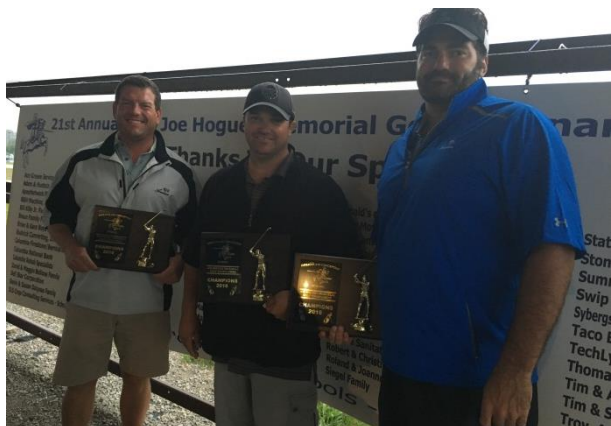
